#### **COURSE UPDATE**

Members will have noticed considerable drying out of the course over the last few weeks, a much warmer and drier period than normal; interspersed with hot, humid periods. The latter always brings with it challenges for managing the greens, especially keeping on top of fungal outbreaks. Irrigation requirements have been high with several weeks of high evapotranspiration. Although as I write this heavy rain is falling. Hooray! Green speeds (as measured by stimpmeter) have been down a little from previous years at this time of year. A number of factors at play, partly weather, seemingly more vigorous Poa growth on the greens than some years (our greens are dominantly browntop but Poa is present in some to a more or less extent). Green speeds and consistency of roll should improve over the next few weeks and competitors in the Hams may have found putting more approachable. Much work went into course preparation in the days leading up to the Hams, once again a successful event, and my thanks to all the team for time and effort.

Coming up we still have a lot of work to do, especially maintaining our aging irrigation system, attempting to improve the tees, although this will always be a challenge until we can get automated irrigation, keeping on top of the many recurring tasks and at the same time promoting the odd new project. And, hopefully in the next week, we can undertake another verticut and needle tine on the greens. We have had some extra help with Garney volunteering to look after the rough on the bank of No 8, and on the approach to No 14 green. The red pegged area adjacent to No 14 remains just that, a penalty area. This will not be regularly managed except for noxious weeds, so don't go in there! If you should, use whichever is the closest drop zone (front by the steps or at rear of green). A penalty of one will be taken, but the steps and track itself are GUR, again use drop zone without penalty.
