# **COURSE UPDATE**

While players might enjoy the fairway run, the greens are a challenge to manage, with conditions favourable for dollar spot and maintaining adequate water capacity across greens a battle. Although some rain as I write this.

Just a couple of things to bring to all members attention:

#### Hole maintenance and good etiquette:

Members are rather spoilt in that we try and cut new holes every Friday (and occasionally an extra cut for a special competition day). Kieran and Micky commit to try and do this, and the new hole is rolled on Saturday morning. Just occasionally a Friday is missed, but regardless, members can help keep the holes in best possible condition for others by following a few simple rules. Just to remind everyone:

- 1. **DO NOT** use your putter or the flag stick to pull ball from hole, gently remove flagstick and use tool at end of your arm, <u>it's called a hand</u>. I know some use suction cups on their putter but please take care that the side of the hole is not damaged.
- 2. Take care returning flagstick to centre slot vertically, please and don't ram it in! Extra care when retrieving one's ball can help reduce the amount of damage that occurs, but some is to be expected regardless, try and delicately fix for next player.



#### The new drain along RHS No 1:

Members will now be aware of this and for now we have pegged it as GUR. The OB is still the boundary, just the drain is GUR. We are still thinking how we might manage it long term. I would have preferred an extension of the pipe from the stormwater run off all the way to the road drain. But as it's an ODC asset cost their option was for a shallow drain (swale) - it might be grassed and mown, not so sure. But the drain will do the job and stop storm water from running across the number I fairway and making its way down to our no 3. Hopefully when the rain eventually comes, we will see less flooding on the course which severely restricted cart use last winter.

### Opening of No 6:

Green was played on opening day, and is now in play. As most of you know this project has brought lots of challenges. So, while open for play, there is still a need for a lot of tidying up, especially the surrounds. The latter still rough so there will be 'through the green club length placing' when playing 6, not in the penalty area of course. More work will be done during greens renovation week. We will be mowing with the donated bowling club electric mower (different height of cut) until after coring, when we will gradually bring the green into alignment with the other greens in respect to mowing height. Rolling as per normal greens schedule is being undertaken. The green is fairly soft so don't forget to repair pitch marks!

Please observe the cart parking area as directed by roped area; no carts are to be taken up to the green. The ladies No. 6 track has been cleared and is usable.

The practice green will be renovated and brought back up to a better standard, so keep off until further notice.
